Dear Friends

The month of November includes the feast of Christ the King, which is celebrated on the final Sunday of the liturgical year. This year that's Sunday 21st November.

It may surprise you that this feast is a relatively modern innovation. It was first introduced in the Roman Catholic Church by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The liturgical revisions in both Catholic and Reformed churches in the second half of the twentieth century resulted – happily – in a greater unity between our calendars and lectionaries, and the feast of Christ the King was formally introduced to the Church of England's calendar in 2000.

It's a tremendous feast to celebrate. We are reminded that Jesus Christ is the King of the Universe, that there is nothing and no one beyond his rule of love. As the Church's year ends we are reminded that his reign never ends, and his throne is eternal. As we rejoice in his glory and majesty, we also have the hope that we too, when the years of our earthly existence have passed, will share in that glory and majesty in heaven.

But it's not just about where Christ is now. The feast is as much about the present as it is the future. Every time we pray we say 'thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven'. While we await the joy of heaven we are called to build a better earth which reflects the harmony, beauty and virtue of the heaven for which we long. This is an earth where the gentle, just and perfect reign of Jesus Christ is a reality for all people.

May that be our prayer as we celebrate Christ the King this year.



We first met Calum on the steps of St Paul's Cathedral after he had been made deacon. Little did we know at the time how much of an impact he would have on our lives and that of this Parish. Generous in spirit he is always excellent company and we are sad to see him go.

We have been very fortunate in the calibre of curates at our church and Calum is no exception. When we first came to services here we heard some excellent sermons from Marcus Walker and it was clear he was much liked by the congregation. Stephen Coleman was also a good preacher and ably led us through the interregnum following the departure of Will Adam. Calum has definitely carried on this tradition; his sermons over the Triduum last Easter (to mention just one example) were power-

ful, incredibly moving and thought provoking.

Calum will also be remembered for the work he has done with the children of the parish. He took the confirmation classes for the youngsters being confirmed this year and who can forget his performances in the crib services? He may say he was forced into it but we think he rather enjoyed himself. He has probably already packed that blond wig!

We have also benefited from Calum's musical talent. Most recently he helped our Sunday School children learn a song for the Harvest Festival and he sung the Exultet beautifully at the Vigil on Easter Eve this year.

Calum is a very caring person and always remembers to ask how things are if you have shared a concern or he knows you or a friend or relative have been unwell. He is mature beyond his years and has a faith that shines through to those who meet him. Many of us really appreciated his instigation and leadership of Lectio Divina. It was originally intended to just be held during Lent until the Coronavirus pandemic hit. Most of the services had to be held via Zoom and Calum kindly carried on with these for some time after Lent which was a great help in sustaining us during lockdown.

In some ways it is a shame that the pandemic has had such an impact on Calum's time with us but perhaps it was meant to be as he helped to make a difference to our spiritual life during a very difficult time. We will certainly miss Calum very much but send him to St Albans with our love and prayers.

Many congratulations to three members of our congregation who have recently become governors at local Church Schools. Liz Veitch has been appointed as a governor at St George's School Freezywater, Sarah Elkins has been appointed as a governor at St Andrew's School Southgate and Theresa Davis has been appointed as a governor at St Paul's School.

Their appointment comes at a time when there are quite a few governor vacancies to be filled at Church Schools in our Deanery.

Serving as a school governor is a fantastic way to serve and support a Church School. Local parishes, the Enfield Deanery and the LDBS (London Diocesan Board for Schools) all appoint governors to serve in the many Church Schools in the Enfield Deanery. Governors can make a significant difference to the running of these schools, having particular responsibility for making sure their school promotes an education which is consistent with the faith and practice of the Church of England, and that the Christian ethos of the school is preserved and developed. They are also instrumental in supporting ongoing improvement and development in schools

Governors are volunteers. For many, serving as a governor in a Church School is an expression of their own Christian discipleship and service. As previously mentioned, there are currently a number of unfilled vacancies on Church School governing bodies across the Deanery. Volunteers are needed to fill these spaces.

A wide range of knowledge and expertise is a welcome addition to any Governing Body. Having worked with a Governing Body that included a priest, a pathologist, a retired nurse, a dog breeder, a civil servant, someone taking a career break to bring up their children, a police officer and a college lecturer, as well as staff governors, my experience was that their wide distribution of skills and knowledge was beneficial to the development and improvement of the school. Every one of them had something to offer.

Do you feel called to fill one of the spaces on a Governing Body of a Church School somewhere within the Enfield Deanery? If you do, why not have a word with Fr Daniel or one of the three recently appointed governors - Liz, Sarah or Theresa - and find out more.

LYNN VAN KEULEN

At the end of October the following statement from Bishop Rob was read out in church:

'Dear friends, after some considerable reflection and discernment Lynn van Keulen is responding to a deep sense of calling to hospital chaplaincy. Lynn has therefore joined the team of bank chaplains at University College London Hospital to pursue this vocation further. As a consequence, Lynn will no longer be ministering formally at St Paul's, but she will continue to attend as and when she can, and is still very much part of the church family. Please keep Lynn in your prayers, as she will keep St Paul's in her prayers too.'



Lynn has been one of our Licensed Lay Preachers (formerly known as Readers) since 2012 and she will certainly be missed. In addition to her preaching and the way she led many services in the past, particularly Healing Services and Evensong, Lynn has earned a well-deserved reputation for compassionate and prayerful support of members of our church,

and their families, when facing serious illness or bereavement

Lynn has always been actively involved in charity work, both professionally and here at St Paul's. She was part of the small group that organised events to raise the money needed to build a school in Negage, our link parish in Angola. Her energy and enthusiasm were a real boost to the fund raising activities. She also used these gifts when she was a member

of our Charity Group and she is an enthusiastic supporter of the work of the Mothers' Union.

It is good to know that Lynn will continue her association with St Paul's Church and be part of our church family as she follows her calling to concentrate on hospital chaplaincy. As Bishop Rob reminds us in his statement, Lynn will benefit from our prayers as she begins this new part of her journey of faith, as will those she ministers to in hospitals.



lan Francis Kay was born in Hampstead where he, with his two older siblings, enjoyed a very happy childhood with their parents.

He attended The Hall preparatory school before joining his brother at Sutton Valance School in Kent in May 1937.

The school remained open during the Second World War as, due to its size and coastal location, it acted as beacon/guide to both

Allied and German aircraft and so was not bombed, and thus lan was able to continue attending there. Whilst at Sutton Valance, he became a King's Scout, with certificates in areas such as electrician and master at arms. In July 1941, he sat the National School Certificate examination in nine subjects. He had one term in the sixth form but had to leave in December 1941 as his father had lost his business due to the War.

lan went into the insurance business and joined the General Accident Fire and Life Assurance Corporation in February 1942.

In May 1943, at the age of $17^{3}/_{4}$, lan volunteered for the Royal Air Force and was accepted for training to be a navigator. As the training schools were full, he was placed on deferred service and returned to the G.A. to await call up.

In June 1944, lan was called up and started training. This was never completed because, after the end of the war in 1945, training was suspended, although he remained in the RAF and was posted to various airfields such as Bardney in Lincolnshire. Ian was demobbed in August 1947 at the same rank as when he joined – Aircraftman 2nd Class! He never forgot his number 185398 and during a M.U. visit in 2015 to Bentley Priory, Fighter Command HQ, he was able to immediately snap to attention and provide it.

lan returned to the insurance world and then subsequently worked for various insurance companies and brokers. He became an executive director of Chambers and Newman and retired in August 1989, returning part time until February 2002 so as to complete 60 years in insurance, during

which time he was awarded the honour of Freeman of the City of London. lan's involvement with Sutton Valance School continued after he left and in 1948 he was asked to join the Old Suttonians Association committee on which he served for some fifty years. He remained committed to the O.S.A and S.V.S until his death.

In 1910, S.V.S. had become part of the United Westminster Schools Foundation and on the 8th October 2010, a service was held at Westminster Abbey to commemorate this special anniversary. Ian was asked to speak at the service and he regarded this privilege and honour as possibly the greatest in his life when he addressed the congregation of nearly one thousand people.

lan was a keen hockey player and was a member of Hendon Hockey Club for over 50 years. In the early 1950's, lan was a co-founder of the Insur-

ance Hockey Association in London and he carried on playing until 2001 and so enjoyed over fifty years on hockey pitches.

lan married Hilary in 1959 and in 1960 they moved to Winchmore Hill. They remained living in the same family home for the rest of their lives; some 60 years in lan's case. Here they brought up three children, Caroline, Nicola and Nigel with much love and laughter along the way. Ian subsequently became a doting grandfather to Emily, Arran, Zoe and Thomas. Being a very keen (not to mention competitive) card player - many a Saturday afternoon in recent years was spent enjoying the Kay carding club.



lan was a dedicated gardener and won many prizes at local horticultural shows both for vegetables and flowers, along with being an avid cricket fan and a member of both Middlesex Cricket Club and the MCC.

Both Ian and Hilary immediately joined this church when arriving in Winchmore Hill in 1960. Ian with his sense of commitment and responsibility, played an active role – not just as a member of the badminton club but over the years as a church warden, a member of the PCC and also a sideman into his 90's.

More than that, lan was always happy to provide time and support to

anyone who wanted his help and he greatly enjoyed supporting new members of the church.

lan unstintingly supported Hilary in her role of Reader, although, having a great sense of humour, he did hold up score cards at the back of the church when she finished giving her first sermon!

Having worked his way through to 5 vicars, on reaching his mid 90's, lan played a less active role at St Paul's although he continued to read out on Remembrance Sunday the names of those in the church who gave their lives in both wars. He regarded this as a great honour.

lan's special qualities included, not only a talent for telling interesting stories, but a great capacity to make friends and to retain them over the years. So neighbours became close friends, as did people met on holiday and a boy he met on his second day of school back in 1937 remained one of his closest friends for 82 years.

And of course, those at St Paul's became another family to him, providing him with love and support when required over the years, particularly since 2015 when his beloved Hilary died.

lan was an absolute gentleman who espoused the values of kindness, respect, patience, loyalty, integrity, selflessness, reliability and responsibility throughout his life.

lan had a great sense of humour, often having a twinkle in his eyes, and he liked shocking people. For example, when he was asked what he had done the first Christmas after Hilary died, lan replied that he had gone to the French Alps and been parascending. All true – at the age of 90!

He will be greatly missed by all.

As is the tradition of the MU, we then adjourned for tea and cakes at the neighbouring Butler's Retreat.








FR CALUM'S INSTALLATION
