Christian vocation

In the Gospels Jesus calls people to follow him and to particular forms of service. Christians believe the risen Christ calls people to service today – the word ‘vocation’ means a call.

All Christians try to live out their faith in their workplace.

Some Christians fulfil their vocation and earn their living mainly through their daily work.

Some Christians earn their living through their daily work to support their calling to ministry in other ways (as St Paul made tents to support himself).

Discovering your vocation at different periods of your life is an important part of being a disciple.

First principles of Christian stewardship

All that we have comes from God. God calls us to be good stewards of all we have been given. God is concerned not simply with what we give but how we approach all we have. According to Genesis 1 and 2, our stewardship extends to caring for the whole world.

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power,
the glory, the splendour and the majesty;
for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.
All things come from you,
and of your own do we give you.

Bible study

How should we give?

God has given so much to us and asks us to be as generous in return. The New Testament instruction is to give:


- *in proportion to our income;*
- *in a regular and disciplined way;*

- *in a way that is realistic to the need;*
- *in secret;*
- *with joy.*

God is more concerned about how we give than about how much.

Tithing

The Old Testament standard of giving was the tithe – one tenth of our income. Many Christians still give in this way. For some, giving a tenth will be something to work towards. For others it will be just a beginning.



Understanding your church's finances

Work out your answers to the following questions in small groups:


- *What was your total church expenditure for last year?*

- *How much does that work out at each week?*
- *What proportion of income comes from the giving of church members?*
- *How much tax was reclaimed from charitable covenants?*

For discussion: How much do you think church members should be called upon to give?

Steps into giving

These are some steps people make in their giving from when they first become Christians. Don't feel pressured. Pray about your giving and talk it over with your family. God is patient with us in this area (as in every other). If the rest of your family are not Christians that will clearly affect your own giving.

- *Casual giving.*
- *Responsible giving.*
- *Proportional giving.*
