Dear Friends

It's common now to observe a 'Dry January' - a month of abstaining from booze as part of a post-festive detox. I am wholly opposed to this idea. January can be depressing enough; why make it worse?

Seriously, 'Dry January' is a symptom of an increasingly post-Christian society. In the church year Christians are called to abstain from things *in preparation* for festivals, not as a means to recover from them. We have Lent as a time to give something up. And Christian abstinence has an outward focus. Rather than being focussed on our own self-improvement, it calls us to improve the world.

Enough about Lent – that's next month. And, as it happens, I quite enjoy January. We're only just half way through the twelve days of Christmas when it begins. There's the Epiphany to look forward to, and I am delighted that once again this year we'll be keeping the feast on 6th January – not transferring it to the nearest Sunday – with a 6pm Eucharist. And, here at St Paul's, the month concludes with our Patronal Festival, celebrating the conversion of St Paul. This year we look forward to welcoming the Bishop of Lewes, Will Hazlewood, as our preacher at a 10am All-Together Eucharist.

I hope and pray that we all may have a happy New Year. And may that start with a *happy* January. Let us rejoice in the revelation of Jesus Christ, which we celebrate at Epiphany, and celebrate with great joy the conversion of St Paul, in whose honour this parish is dedicated.

Every year the Ministry Team scratches its heads thinking of a theme for a series of magazine articles. And this time, we've decided to put the ball in your court!

Most churchgoers are sitting on questions they've never had the temerity to ask. 'Why did Jesus have to die?' and 'Why does God permit suffering?' are two of many theological questions people grapple with. Then there are questions about what we do in church. 'Why do the clergy wear special robes?' 'Why does the date of Easter change?' And yet more questions about the ordering of the church. 'What is the Anglican Communion?' or 'What's the difference between a priest and a vicar?' (I think this last question is the one I have been asked the most in 13 years of ordained ministry!)

Feel free to ask anonymously, although if you put your name to your question we can make sure you know how it'll be answered.

So, get asking! Remember, there is no such thing as a stupid question. Indeed, quite the opposite. A faith which asks questions is a lively and engaged faith, and lively and engaged Christians make a lively and engaged church.
