Dear Friends

When I was a child my grandmother bought me a bird book and encouraged me to identify birds in the garden. Many of you will have similar memories of your grandparents. If you are a grandparent yourself perhaps you are continuing this venerable grandparental tradition.

I have always valued the birdlife in the Vicarage garden, a sentiment which, alas, has not been shared by the Vicarage cats. This year, now we are (sadly) cat-less, we have encouraged our winged friends with a few bird-feeders. Over the last couple of weeks, as spring attempts to pierce through the gloom of winter, we are seeing each day goldfinches, blue tits, coal tits, great tits, robins, wrens, redwings, black-caps, pigeons, an adorable pair of collared doves, starlings, noisy parakeets (rather less welcome), magpies, crows, blackbirds, and (my favourite) the greater spotted woodpecker. In what has felt like a particularly dark and dank start to 2026 (and I don't just refer to the weather) their sight and song has cheered me. Spring will come!

By the time you read this, we will already be a good way through Lent. This sacred season is sometimes called the 'springtime of the soul', partly because – in our hemisphere at least – it coincides with actual spring, but also because it is a time for us to grow spiritually, for the buds of faith to open up, for light to fill in our inmost beings.

I hope and pray that the sights and sounds of spring may awaken a springtime in your soul as it is mine, and that we may all grow in faith and holiness.

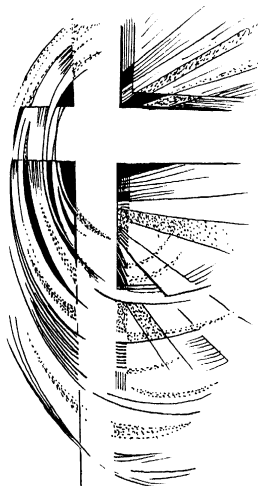

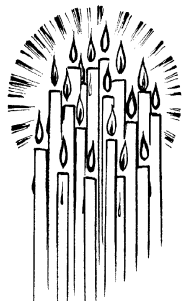

We have been truly blessed as Elouise has provided numerous exciting opportunities for our children and young people to enjoy hearing the Christian message and celebrate Christian festivals and seasons. It has been obvious from the number of children attending our three Sunday Schools (KS1, KS2 and KS3) and from their enthusiasm when sharing what they have been doing at Sunday School with the congregation at the end of Sunday services, that Elouise made belief in God joyful and enjoyable. As well as week to week activities, she also organised Lent and Easter activities, a living nativity with live sheep and goats in the 'stable', and the annual Sunday School Nativity Play (not easy with a large cast of under 11 year-olds). 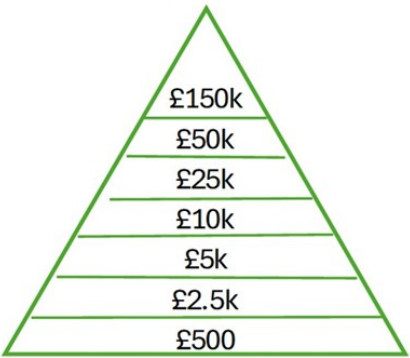
Last month, we launched Project 200 which aims to turn our vision to rejuvenate and refurbish St Paul's Church Hall into a reality, in celebration of our bicentenary in 2028.

Over £55,000 has already been pledged or donated, plus another £10,000 with Gift Aid, so we are off to a fantastic start towards our target from the church community. 10 households have pledged more than £500. Huge thanks to all who have contributed, so far, for their generosity. It really is making a difference. Below is our Pledge Pyramid showing what we need for the full project.

## Project 200: Buy-a-Brick Lego Build at Joyful Noise



At January's Joyful Noise service, we kicked off our exciting Buy-a-Brick Lego campaign to help build the future St Paul's Church Hall. Every child receives a special loyalty card, which is stamped for each £20 donation made to buy a Lego brick.

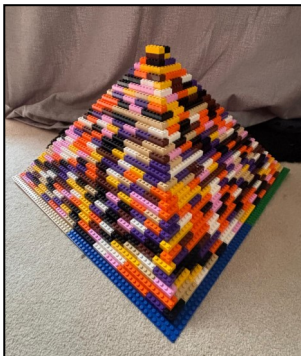
For every four bricks purchased, you'll receive a fifth brick free - thanks to Gift Aid, which allows us to reclaim the cost from the government, if you're eligible.

Completed loyalty cards are proudly displayed on the St Paul's Kids appreciation board in Church, forming part of our growing card pyramid. Children use the bricks to help build a Lego Pyramid model, with the goal of reaching 3,000 bricks - a real Joyful Noise community achievement.

## OPEN CHURCH



Did you know that St Paul's Church is normally open for people to visit and pray in every day of the week from 9am to 5pm? It provides a quiet space in which to think and pray away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. Fr Daniel touched on this in his sermon on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> February, the first Sunday in Lent. Part of this sermon is reproduced below.

'In the wilderness, Jesus is tested by the devil. The point of this is to prove that Jesus, the Son of God, is beyond temptation. As St Paul explains in his letter to the Romans, just as sin came through the one man, Adam, the free gift of grace comes through Jesus. He is the Second Adam, who is different from the First Adam because of his obedience, because he is sinless.

So part of our wilderness of Lent is to become more like Jesus in our obedience, in our avoidance of sin. The devil lures us into sin. Temptation surrounds us. We are constantly being tested. Lent is a time for repentance, and renewal. "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return," we heard said to us on Ash Wednesday, "turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ." The wilderness provides us with a place to turn away from sin, to rediscover our faithfulness to Jesus. The wilderness is a place to face up to those sins which have become habitual, and to be more intentional about weeding them out of our lives.

And I want to suggest that perhaps this church building might be a wilderness for us, a place which is set aside precisely to enable us to live a better Lent. I am often surprised at how many people don't know that this church building is open every day – it is ready for you to come and be silent, to get away from whatever it is which might distract you. It

is a place to pray. You can do that on your own at any time, or with others at Morning and Evening Prayer or the midweek Eucharist.'

The St Paul's Charity Group held their ever-popular annual Curry Night on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> February to raise funds for One-to-One, our annual charity, The church hall was transformed for the evening with beautifully themed decorations. The food was plentiful and delicious and enjoyed by all who came, including a group from One-to-One.

The event raised £500 for the local charity One-to-One, which assists autistic people and those living with learning disabilities to live fuller lives, to be heard and to feel truly included. ### Grace's Story †

When Grace became pregnant at 15, her parents rejected her. She had to leave home and school, with no income, no health insurance, and nowhere to go. This woman prayed with her, helped her find shelter, and welcomed her into their local 'Umuryango' community support programme.

Through that connection, Grace received guidance, faith-based counselling, and practical help. Thanks to the business skills she learnt and the counselling and support she received, Grace can now feed and clothe her child. She even helps other young mothers in a similar position. Her parents now visit her with pride, and her younger sister sees Grace as a strong role model.
