# Dear Friends

Undoubted highlights of June will be our annual Baptism and Confirmation on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June, and Fr Pete's Ordination to the Priesthood, at St Pancras, Euston, on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> June, and his First Mass on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> June. Please pray earnestly for those to be baptised, confirmed and received into the communion of the Church of England, that they may continue to grow in faith. And pray for Fr Pete as he prepares to receive the priesthood of Jesus Christ and celebrate the Eucharist for the first time.

These services are also important because they mark the end of Bishop Rob's ministry as Bishop of Edmonton. The Baptism and Confirmation will be the last of many visits to the parish, and the Ordination will be his final act as our Area Bishop before he moves on to be CEO of the Church Urban Fund. As we thank God for Bishop Rob's tireless and faithful ministry among us, so too do we pray for the direction of the Holy Spirit in the process of appointing a new Bishop of Edmonton.

During such vacancies, another member of the London College of Bishops is usually appointed as Acting Bishop for roughly 6-9 months. Bishop Sarah has appointed the Bishop of Fulham, Jonathan Baker, to this role, and a letter of introduction is included in this magazine. Please pray for him too.

Through times of change and transition I am often reminded of a hymn which speaks of the constancy of the God who never changes:

Through all the changing scenes of life, in trouble and in joy, the praises of my God shall still my heart and tongue employ.

This is also a good moment to share with you that the Diocese is permitting me a period of study leave in 2024. (Stipendiary clergy are able to apply for three months' study leave after every ten years of ministry.) I will be away for the months of April, May and June next year. We've timed this carefully so that parish life will continue with little change, including Fr Pete having his feet firmly under the altar. But that's a long way off!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Edmonton Episcopal Area

I was honoured when Bishop Sarah invited me to serve you as Acting Bishop of Edmonton until a new bishop is installed to succeed Bishop Rob as your Area Bishop.

The period of vacancy when one bishop has moved on and the next is not yet in place can be a time of some anxiety and uncertainty. It has long been the tradition in the Diocese of London that another member of the London College of Bishops serves as acting bishop during a vacancy in one of the Area sees, to ensure that episcopal oversight, and especially the pastoral ministry which flows from it, is in place without interruption. In this sense, my appointment is 'business as usual.' I hope very much that in the next six to eight months, I will be able to offer support, encouragement, and a listening ear for you all. I look forward to being among you for prayer and worship, to licensing new Incumbents and Priests-in-Charge during the time of vacancy, and to working with Archdeacon John and the rest of the leadership team in supporting the regular work of the parishes, chaplaincies, and missional communities across the four boroughs of the Edmonton Area.

I do want to assure the clergy of the Area that it is my firm intention to serve and support you all equally and to the best of my ability. I shall certainly endeavour to do just that.

Over my ten years in post as Bishop of Fulham I have got to know many of the parishes, clergy and people of the Edmonton Area, and not only those whom I serve in my habitual episcopal ministry. It will be a privilege now to extend that knowledge much more widely and deeply across the Area as a whole. I look forward very much to working with you and for you in the coming months.

Quilting's popularity grew in the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries when it became important





both professionally, in wool tradingareas like Canterbury, London and Exeter, and domestically, for pleasure and as a cottage industry. We were also told about the military quilts made by servicemen in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Having explained the difference between quilting and patchwork, the talk ended with Theresa showing us a beautiful array of different styles and designs of quilts and patchwork that she had created in recent years.
